



BSc (Hons) Pre-Registration Nursing (Adult and Mental Health) Interview Guidance

Thank you for booking to attend a UCLan Nursing selection event for the September 2019 intake at the University's Westlakes campus. To help speed up the application process for you we may interview you at the event for the course, prior to you putting in your application at UCAS. This means that once we receive your application you will not need to attend again for interview and if we wish to make you an offer, we can do this on receipt of your application.

In order for us to interview you, it is essential that you bring photographic ID to the selection event as failure to do so will mean we cannot interview you.

The interview process will consist of Values Based Multiple Mini Interviews (MMIs), these will last approximately 20 minutes in total. There will be four stations in total and you will spend approximately three minutes at each station, where you will be asked a question, there will be a different academic and potentially clinical staff at each station.

Please note that candidates will be interviewed concurrently.

PLEASE NOTE THAT A WRITTEN TEST IS NO LONGER PART OF THE SELECTION CRITERIA.

During the interview, you will be asked if you have had any cautions, reprimands or convictions. NB Nursing is exempt from the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act; hence, any past misdemeanour is taken into consideration – if you have any cautions or convictions, within the last two years, we will not be able to interview you and you will need to withdraw and reapply when you are two years clear. You are advised to declare anything that involved you with the police. If you are successful at the interview stage, we will advise you submit your application via UCAS, and further information will be provided on this at the Open Day.
